


Some Guitar Chords

Notation


A black circle is a 'compulsory note', a grey circle is an 'optional note' and a bar is a bar. The letter T signifies that this note should be stopped with the thumb. An X denotes that the string below should not be sounded, either by not strumming it or by damping it with a nearby finger.

All the D chords should be played without the bottom string unless this is stopped with the thumb.


